Supporting narrative

Commentary:

The report to 31 March 2019 for St John the Baptist Catholic MAT is based on data covering 395 relevant employees across 6 Primary Schools and 1 High School in Norfolk and North Suffolk. For all our schools the employee demographic is overwhelmingly female, with 78% of employees being female. The gender pay gap reported within the organisation is driven by large numbers of female employees who hold part time, low hour, low pay scale roles that are inherent to the nature of educational sector. Nearly 90% of roles in “Quartile 1 – Lower” are covered by female staff resulting in a significant median and mean gender pay gap for the Trust.

Between 2018 and 2019 the mean hourly pay difference reduced by 1.3% from 26.8% to 25.5%. The information for the individual schools differs school by school, with one academy showing gender pay gap in favour of women.

In the last year we developed the Gender Pay Gap Action plan which will further help us understand our Gender Pay Gap and signal to employees and the public our commitment to taking serious steps to tackle it. Using the Government Equalities Office’s guidance the action plan follows the 4-steps approach with the following stages:

- 1 - Analyse data and identify actions,
- 2 - Consult and Engage,
- 3 - Revise, assess and embed the action plan and
- 4 - Allow enough time.

The Trust is monitoring pay carefully, with the support of the Teaching Unions, to ensure that the Gender gap narrows and eventually closes within all the sectors of the workforce.
